- *Seneca Re-Ad Industries, Inc. v. Hugler and Steward, Felton and Magers v. Seneca Re-Ad Industries, Inc.* - Represents three individuals employed at a sheltered workshop in Seneca County, Ohio who were among the first to successfully challenge their receipt of subminimum wages in an administrative proceeding under the Fair Labor Standards Act, and who are currently seeking additional relief under the FLSA and Ohio law.
