Profile

Brett Felter joined Brown, Goldstein & Levy as its first Disability Rights Fellow in September 2009. Prior to joining the firm, Brett clerked for the Honorable Diane M. Johnsen on the Arizona Court of Appeals. He also worked at Texas RioGrande Legal Aid interviewing callers to its telephone intake line.

During law school, Brett mediated disputes from small-claims court as a student mediator in the University of Texas School of Law Mediation Clinic. He also interned for the American Civil Liberties Union of Texas, where he investigated various civil rights claims. In 2006-2007, Brett served as Co-Editor-in-Chief of the *Texas Journal on Civil Liberties & Civil Rights*.

In 2010, Brett was elected to the Board of Directors of the Maryland Disabilities Forum, a non-profit cross-disability organization led by people with disabilities that provides leadership in facilitating systems change to achieve community inclusion, civil rights, and equal opportunities for people with disabilities.
